### John 5:39,40

- The Jewish religious leaders studied the Old Testament with great diligence—they believed that if one could comprehend the words of the text, they would gain a share in the world to come.

## What's Your Sign?

### John 5:39,40

- Mistakes in reading: Reading with the mind only.
  - Reading with an open mind but a shut heart not allowing the Spirit to guide us into the Truth (1Cor.2:12,13; Ep.1:18)
  - Reading not to hear from God but to find arguments and conformations to support our own beliefs. (unlearning??)
- An even bigger mistake: Regarding God as having only given us a written revelation.
  - The Revelation of God is a revelation in history.
  - It is not God speaking, but God acting.
  - The Bible itself is not His complete revelation; it is the record of His revelation.

## What's Your Sign?

### John 5:39,40

□ v. 40:

- There is only one proper way to read the Bible to read it as all pointing to Jesus.
- Then many of the things which puzzle us, and sometimes distress us, are clearly seen as stages along the way, a pointing forward to Jesus, Who is The Revelation.
- The Jews worshipped a God who wrote rather than a God who acted and therefore when Christ came they did not recognize Him.
- The function of the scriptures is not to give life, but to point to the Person Who can, Jesus.
