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What Do You Know?

What would a disciple (talmid) learn from his or her Rabbi? Discipline! - Training that corrects, molds, and shapes our character

- The Inward Disciplines:
- Prayer; Meditation; Worship; Fasting; Study
- The Outward Disciplines:
 - Simplicity; Solitude; Submission; Service
- The Corporate Disciplines:
 - Confession; Praise; Guidance; Celebration

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What Do You Know?

Where do we begin our journey with Jesus as our Rabbi? With a Hebrew understanding of what it means to truly know something.

Matthew 11:27 - know

- SINÔSKŐ (*'ρινωσκω*) to be taking in knowledge, to come to know, recognize, understand, or to understand completely (EPIGINÔSKŐ).
- GINŌSKŌ frequently indicates a relationship between the person knowing and the object known.

What is atonement?

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What Do You Know?

How do we begin to truly know - from the heart instead of from the head?

There is only one way to know truths in our hearts:

- 1 Corinthians 2:10-14
- Corintmans 2:10-14
 Only through the presence of the Spirit of the Truth in our hearts! (John 16:13)

 1 John 2:27 the Spirit will teach us truths in our heart!
 In order for the written Word of God to became a living Word from God to me, He must give us "a spirit of wisdom and revelation in the knowledge of Him."

 Ephesians 1:17-19 that we may know!

- When we know something deep in our heart, nothing can shake or rattle us. Nothing.

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What Do You Know?

Paul demonstrates this to us in many places:

- 2 Corinthians 11:23-27
- Romans 1:16 "I am not ashamed"
- 2 Timothy 1:12 "for I know whom I have believed"
